Letter from the Executive Director

Long Island is fortunate that the arts continue year round, and summer in Huntington is filled with vibrant performing and visual arts events.

The Huntington Summer Arts Festival offers 42 evenings of performances with something for everyone, featuring the best of local, national and international talents. Please look at the schedule and plan to attend as many evenings as you can. There is also a variety of events all over Long Island that receive funding from our Grants for the Arts program.

Our Exhibition Program features several different shows in our Main Street Gallery. The *Member Showcase* in June celebrates the wealth of talent of our artists in an eclectic showing of a variety of works and genres. This is followed by *Stars, Stripes and Pin Ups: Work Inspired By Sailor Jerry*, a juried show curated by Keith Tobolski. The show runs from June 29 to July 21, and is a great way to celebrate Americana and the Fourth of July. We will then feature works by Long Island artists who have been awarded grants through our Decentralization Program;

DEC the Walls runs from July 27 to August 18. Next up will be another juried show Wearable Art, featuring works that meet at the intersection of fashion and fine art, followed by Beyond the Sound beginning September 21, showcasing works by three of HAC's artist members: Jean Cohn, Grainne de Buitlear and Michael Ricigliano.

Education remains a priority at HAC. Our Arts-in-Education JOURNEY Program winds down with the close of the school year, but plans are already under way for the fall, beginning with our CTLE certified teaching training workshops. HAC is also proud to announce that we will host the first Long Island Entrepreneur Boot Camp in cooperation with New York Foundation for the Arts, in partnership with the New York State Council on the Arts. Our fellow arts councils throughout long island will assist in planning and implementation (see page 4).

As always, I extend my gratitude to the Town of Huntington, Suffolk County and New York State for their continued support of the Huntington Summer Arts Festival and

other programs at Huntington Arts Council. We are truly fortunate to live in an area that recognizes the importance of the arts in our daily lives as well as the strong economic impact the arts have on a community. to home. We're certain that you won't be disappointed with what Huntington has to

A perennial favorite is Huntington's Summer Arts Festival, now in its 53rd year. This year's free performances are scheduled every Tuesday through Sunday evening from June 26 through August 12 on Heckscher Park's Chapin Rainbow Stage, with additional Thursday evening concerts by the Northport Community Band at the Robert W. Krueger Bandstand in Village Park in Northport. It's difficult to imagine how the Festival could improve on the outstanding opening weekend lineup of Tony-nominated

Star Melissa Errico performing vocals with Grammy & Emmy winner Bryan Batt on piano (June 29) followed by The Lords of 52nd Street (Billy Joel's original band) with Richie Cannata (June 30). However, I am very excited about the roster of top-notch jazz performers featured during Huntington Jazz Week (July 17-22), including the day-long activities during the ever-popular "Coltrane Day" on July 21st presented in collaboration with Friends of the Coltrane Home. Also on the "not to be missed list" are Americana/Roots & Folk Weekend (July 27, 28 & 29) and "Bernstein's America" with Music Director & Conductor David Stuart Wiley and Orchestra Long Island celebrating the 100th Birthday of Leonard Bernstein (August 4).

In addition to the Summer Arts Festival's regular "Family Night" performances on Tuesdays, another cultural program much-beloved by families is the free "Movies on the Lawn" series. A complete listing of the dates, locations, and scheduled movies can be found in this newspaper.

Among the other "must sees" this summer are some terrific exhibitions offered by The Heckscher Museum of Art, including "Heavy Metal: The Photographs of Jan Staller," "The Age of Tiffany: Between Nouveau and Deco," and "Long Island Biennial" - along with diverse related programs and events for adults, families, and children. In particular I invite you to join the free family arts festival, Draw Out!, which takes place on September 23rd both in the Museum and outdoors in Heckscher Park. New York Foundation for the Arts (NYFA), in partnership with the New York State Council on the Arts' State & Local Partnerships program and Huntington Arts Council is pleased to announce the third year of the NYSCA/NYFA Artist as Entrepreneur Boot Camp, a series of ongoing professional development programs for the arts communities in New York State.

The NYSCA/NYFA Artist as Entrepreneur Boot Camp is an intensive, multi-day professional development opportunity that delves into the fundamental principles of sustainability in the arts. Featured topics will include strategic planning, finance, law, marketing, and fundraising. Additional material will be drawn from NYFA's popular textbook The Profitable Artist (Allworth Press, 2011).

The structure is a blend of formal lectures, discussions, and breakout groups. Participants work through a flexible and dynamic "action plan," and other entrepreneurial tools that provide a blueprint for their practice or specific projects.

There is no charge to participate in the NYSCA/NYFA Artist as Entrepreneur Boot Camp Program. Artists interested in attending are required to apply, and participants are selected through a panel review process. Artists of all disciplines

and career stages, including students, are encouraged to apply.





Arts in Education - JOURNEY

For over 30 years the Huntington Arts Council has been working with local school districts to facilitate the multicultural, artsin-education program, JOURNEY. The goal of the JOURNEY program is to promote and support the appreciation of cultural diversity and tradition through art. The program has been active in schools since its inception in 1985 when Chairperson Sandy Chapin, local area educators and local district administrators worked together to start this unique program. There are four major components; CTLE Cultural Arts Workshops for teacher professional development, Discovery Chests, Visiting Teaching Artists to schools and High Arts Showcase.

We are thrilled to announce we now have a Middle East Discovery Chest in production! We are so grateful to the Harry Chapin Foundation for sponsoring this chest, the second in two years, and for their continuous support for the JOURNEY program and all its components. Because of the support and backing of the Harry Chapin Foundation, the JOURNEY program has been evolving and supporting local schools for over 30 years. The Middle East Discovery Chest is estimated to be available for school loans starting September 2019-2020

The current 2017-2018 participating JOURNEY partner school districts are: Commack, Harborfields, Huntington, Northport-East Northport, Plainview-Old Bethpage and South Huntington.

Discovery Chests

The Discovery Chests have enhanced the curriculum by bringing hands on experiences to students, right at their desks. These bins are filled with cultural artifacts, lessons, books, artworks, musical instruments and other tools for teachers to use at their disposal. Each item is labeled by type and place of origin. There are currently seven cultures represented including Ancient Egypt, Africa, China, Greece, India, Latin America, and Native America.

New! "Still-Life & Music Discovery Chests"

Every year components of the JOURNEY program are being updated and refreshed to reflect teacher requests and suggestions as well as changing student interests. This year, teacher requests have led us to begin loaning out a "Still-Life - Assorted Cultures" Discovery Chest primarily for art classes and also an "Africa Music Chest" with 19 instruments for classroom use. The "Still-Life -Assorted Cultures" Discovery Chest includes cultural artifacts, art texts, music, and textiles from a few of the seven current JOURNEY cultures. Three JOURNEY high school art teachers borrowed the chest this year. These variations on the use of the Discovery Chest have provided the students with a unique experience, letting them interpret and explore their own "journey" with cultures from around the world.

Commack High School Lead Art Teacher, Robert Raeihle, describes how he used the artifacts with his students below:

"The artifacts provided our students with access to unique objects, textures and shapes with challenging color schemes. Students experimented with chalk pastels and explored the techniques for making a piece with this medium. Students develop concepts through processes that are informed by skills, techniques and the objects themselves.

Understanding and appreciating culture is part of the underlying philosophy of the art teachers and classes at Commack High School. Students learn to look at art with an awareness of cultural context as an essential part of their Visual Arts curriculum. By exposing our students to the art and artifacts of other parts of the world our students become more open minded, able to appreciate a range of styles and techniques. This process informs their own growth as artists and the development of their

Latin American Classroom Museum

There are many ways to use the Discovery chests. Inside each is a teacher binder with lesson plans and activities. Teachers have shared with us the different ways they use the chest. This year, Northport teacher Jaime Serna borrowed the Latin America Discovery Chest and together with teachers, Anahi Walton-Shafer and Lisa Hutter, they set up a cultural museum in Mr. Serna's classroom for their students and anyone else in the school to come by and experience it. Mr. Serna tells us more about their classroom museum below:

"We transformed our classroom into a museum during Foreign Language Week. This activity allowed students to experience a world we rarely see. Collaboration from in-school and out-school sources allowed us to teach our students the culture of Latin America through authentic materials. We displayed items from musical instruments to fabrics and clothing of natives in Central and South America. We compared century old artifacts to modern gadgets. We learned about the Aztec and Mayan calendars among other topics shared. I will certainly use the Discovery Latin America Chest every year to celebrate and teach culture to my students."

Teaching Artists in Schools

JOURNEY maintains a directory of over 65 cultural teaching artists and organizations. Each year, JOURNEY schools work with the Huntington Arts Council, Arts in Education coordinator to contract over a dozen workshops and performances in partner schools.

This year Tonito Valderama, taught his workshop titled "The Legacy Project" where he talked about the Native American culture as part of his heritage and then worked with students to draw and paint on ceiling tiles to be displayed in the school's entryway. This is an example of just one of the visual arts program taught with a JOURNEY teaching artist bringing together culture and art to promote cultural appreciation one classroom at a time.




the Lilac Gallery in Manhattan.

Long Island has always been a rich talent pool for the performing and fine arts. We are delighted to shine a L.I. Spotlight on Melissa Errico and The Lords of 52nd Street, our Opening Weekend headliners, plus the newly formed Orchestra Long Island with David Stewart Wiley on August 4. (L.I. Spotlight artists Gathering Time and Kirsten Maxwell will kick-off our Folk Americana weekend on July 27 – see story on page 23).

Friday, June 29 at 8:00 PM -

Tony Award nominated Broadway luminary Melissa Errico grew up in Manhasset on Long Island. Her parents, a public school teacher/sculptor and a physician/concert pianist, supported her early interest in ballet and gymnastics. Melissa's passion for theater was sparked when she appeared in a Girl Scouts production and was cemented by many summers spent at an arts camp where her playful acrobatic skills won her comedic roles in musicals.

Melissa has starred in seven Broadway musicals and released several major solo CDs, including the most recent (2015) What About Today? Melissa Errico Live at 54 Below (Broadway Broadway)



Records). Her digital release *More Lullabies and Wildflowers* was released on Mother's Day 2015 as a benefit for the tenth anniversary of her charity, The Bowery Babes. Errico has worked steadily in non-musical roles in front of the camera, starring in a network TV series *Central Park West*, and doing guest and recurring roles on *The Knick* for Cinemax and *Billions* for Showtime.

Melissa played Clara in the smash hit 2013 Classic Theater Company revival of Passion by Stephen Sondheim, for which she was nominated for a sixth Drama Desk Award. In 2016, she returned to one of her most cherished and lauded roles, Sharon in **Finian's Rainbow**, at The Irish Repertory Theatre. Melissa lives in New York with her husband Patrick McEnroe, their three young daughters and one Yorkshire Terrier named "Pepper."

Before they were **The Lords of 52nd St.**, you could find them playing at local clubs on L.I. as "Topper," a 1960s high school rock and roll band originally formed by **Russell Javors** on guitar and vocals, **Doug Stegmeyer** on bass, and **Liberty DeVitto** on drums. Stegmeyer auditioned for the "Piano Man" **Billy Joel**,

who was forming a new band to record and tour with him regularly. Stegmeyer signed on with bandmates



Javors and DeVitto, and shortly thereafter with Richie Cannata, who later recorded the unforgettable Empire State love song, "New York State of Mind." Never expecting to form one of pop music's most famous bands, the four joined Billy Joel in studio to record his 1976 album *Turnstiles*. The band blew audiences away with their energy and commitment and went from playing local colleges and universities to performing at the world's most famous arenas, helping Joel sell millions of albums.

After the success of the *Turnstiles* album, Joel and the band agreed to work with the legendary Phil Ramone. Ramone and Joel coined DeVitto, Cannata, Javors and Stegmeyer as The Lords of 52nd Street, and went into Columbia Studios to record *The Stranger*. A huge commercial success, the album holds a RIAA diamond certification (10x platinum),

and several #1 singles including, "Only The Good Die Young" and "Just The Way You Are." The band also performed on NBC's "Saturday Night Live." Joel and The Lords returned to the studio to record Grammy award winning albums 52nd Street, Glass Houses, and The Nylon Curtain, and recorded and toured with Joel for over a decade. (Sadly, Doug Stegmeyer passed away in 1995.)

After their induction into the L.I. Music Hall of Fame in 2014, the band decided to reunite after a 30-year separation. Cannata, DeVitto & Javors - backed by new 52nd Street Orchestra members David Clark (keyboards & vocals), Ken Cino (electric guitar), Malcolm Gold (bass) and Doug Kistner (piano) - returned to the stage to a sold out crowd at The Space at Westbury in February 2016. Critics adored the band, their performance blew away fans of all ages and The Lords of 52nd Street have been touring regularly since, giving electrifying live performances wherever they play



2018 Festival Overview

2018 marks the 53rd Huntington Summer Arts Festival! Once again, the Chapin Rainbow Stage in Heckscher Park will be lit up 6 nights per week with touring artists and ensembles from the U.S. and around the globe, as well as the very best local performing arts ensembles. The Wizard of Oz, a Plaza Theatrical production, kicks things off with the first "It's Showtime!" Family Series presentation on Tuesday, June 26. Come early on Tuesdays and join us for a fun, easy FREE craft for the children. The craft table opens at 6:00pm before each Family Show and features a new craft each week. (See page 26 for details on the full Family Series schedule).

A spectacular Opening Weekend brings Melissa Errico (June 29), Tony Awardnominated singer, actress & writer who will dazzle with a special concert SONDHEIM & MORE to mark her debut in Huntington, Long Island, not far from Manhasset where she grew up. Classic Rock rules on (June 30) with **The Lords of 52nd Street**, Billy Joel's backing band on many of his most popular hits. Band mates Doug Stegmeyer, Liberty DeVitto, Russell Javors and Richie Cannata went on to tour and record with Joel for more than ten years, helping Joel establish a popular music career.

World Music is represented by a quintet of talented ensembles. First up Orquesta El Macabeo (July 6) updates traditional Puerto Rican Salsa with a fusion of modern punk rock, ska and reggae rhythms. Based in Las Piedras, Puerto Rico, the band is active in relief efforts following the devastating hurricane that leveled so much of their native Island. Yael Deckelbaum & The Prayer of the Mothers grace our stage the following evening (July 7). Edmar Castaneda is an amazing jazz harp virtuoso from Colombia, South America. He'll perform in Quartet configuration with percussion, trombone, and his equally amazing vocalist & wife Andrea Tierra, for a unique evening you'll never forget.

Huntington Jazz Week will again explore the art of jazz for an entire week, beginning with David Gonzalez' Cuentos: Tales of the Latin World (July 17) - stories & jazz for kids and families; big band swing from HCB (July 18); sizzling contemporary jazz from the Grace Kelly Quartet (July 19)on sax & vocals; Lao Tizer Band (July 20) taking smooth world fusion in a new direction with "Songs from the Swing House;" Coltrane Day returns with afternoon workshops, performances & jams, prior to an evening with legendary sax innovator Joe Lovano Classic Quartet (July 21); and winding up with a memorable evening with the Swingtime Big Band (July 22) and classic tunes from the Great American Songbook plus new versions of

modern favorites.

Americana Folk gets its attention grabbing weekend with L. I.'s own Gathering Time sharing the bill with Kirsten Maxwell (July 27); fiddler/violinist extraordinaire Jeremy Kittel (July 28) brings his Trio to town for an exciting evening of folk, roots & Americana tunes; the 13th Annual Huntington Folk Festival (July 29) copresented with Folk Music Society of Huntington hosting afternoon showcases and song swaps, followed by an evening with legendary folk-singer & songwriter Tom Rush, accompanied by Matt Nakoa.

We welcome back David Stewart Wilev and the newly reorganized Long Island **Orchestra** (August 4), for "Bernstein's America," a celebration of the iconic Lenny's 100th Birthday. Maestro Wiley and the Orchestra (all L.I. Philharmonic alumni) will serve up a delicious evening of Bernstein favorites plus well-known pieces by other important American composers who influenced Bernstein, including Gershwin (Jeffrey Biegel on piano for Rhapsody in Blue), Aaron Copland, Richard Rogers and Irving Berlin!

The Festival's eclectic tradition continues with a delicious sampling of superb artistry and a mix of genres. Fei Fei (July 26) is a gloriously talented classical pianist who plays with a passionate and immersive touch. Incendio (August 2) was nearly rained out when here on their first East Tour. 

Extending from noon until 10:30 p.m., the free festival — co-presented by the Folk Music Society of Huntington (FMSH) and the Huntington Arts Council — is part of the 53rd Huntington Summer Arts Festival.

An on-stage song swap featuring LI's own Miles & Mafale and Carolann Solebello will precede Rush's performance on the park's Chapin Rainbow Stage. Prior to the featured evening concert, Michael Kornfeld's AcousticMusicScene.com and Joe Pszonek's Radio Nowhere will host unplugged showcases and song swaps on the upper lawn area overlooking the stage, featuring a few-dozen artists from New York and several other states from 12 noon-6 p.m. Daytime schedules will be posted online at www.AcousticMusicScene.com, www. Folk icon **Tom Rush** is a gifted musician

whose shows offer a musical celebration and a journey into the tradition and spectrum of what music has been, can be, and will become. His distinctive guitar style, wry humor, and warm, expressive voice have made him



both a legend and a lure to audiences around the world. His shows are filled with the rib-aching laughter of terrific storytelling, the sweet melancholy of ballads, and the passion of gritty blues.

Beginning his career in Boston at the famed Club 47, Tom helped shape the folk revival in the 1960s and the renaissance of the 1980s and 1990s. His early recordings introduced the work of Joni Mitchell, Jackson Browne, and James Taylor. He is credited by Rolling Stone with "ushering in the singer/songwriter era." Now celebrating his fiftieth year on stage and in the studio. Tom continues to break new ground. His most recent release was voted Top Album of the Year by Folk DJL and awarded Folk Album of The Year by the International Folk Alliance. With a vocal blend oft-described as seamless, inspired guitar playing and precise percussion, this talented trio (Stuart Markus, Hillary Foxsong and Gerry McKeveny) evince deep roots in '60s folk-rock, with a healthy dash of traditional folk in the mix. Their stage chemistry makes clear that they take the music (if not themselves) very seriously. A night with Gathering Time will make evident why they were voted one of "Long Island's Best" by the Long Island Press.
