



Northport High School, Capoeira by Omitola Hill and Team for Ms. LaLota, grades 9th-12th,.

Capoeira is an Afro-Brazilian martial art that combines elements of dance. acrobatics, music and spirituality Influenced by enslaved Africans, Indigenous Brazilians and Portuguese influences at the beginning of the 16th century, Capoeira is a constantly evolving art form. It is known for its acrobatic and complex maneuvers, often involving hands on the ground and inverted kicks. The "Ginga," a rocking step, is usually the focal point of the technique and accompanied with music.



Commack High School, Clay Around the World by Gina Mars for Ms. Razzano, grades 11th -12th

Hand building is a ceramics technique that allows you to create forms with clay and your hands, without using a throwing wheel. Before ceramicists invented the wheel, hand building was the only way to create functional and artistic ceramic

forms. The oldest known ceramic artifact was hand built as early as 28,000 BCE. Students created pieces using techniques such as pinching pots, coiling and slab rolling.






