The Summer Arts Festival brought live programming to grateful audiences, and streamed many shows that could be enjoyed in the comforts of viewers' homes. Our Grants for the Arts program moves forward, helping Long Island artists and arts organizations with critical funding for their 2022 programming. Additionally, HAC is proud to administer Restart New York funds for Long Island to encourage in-person events to restart the area economy. Many thanks to our elected officials in Albany for their support of both grant funds. Our JOURNEY Arts in Education program continues to offer services for our eight partner school districts, including 6 CTLE Teacher Professional Development workshops. Our Main Street Gallery continues with a variety of exhibitions,

2021 Huntington Summer Arts Festival – Concert Connections Restored!

We are grateful to the performing artists and attendees for making the 56th Huntington Summer Arts Festival so memorable. For most of the musicians, actors and dancers, it was their first public performance in a year-and-a-half, and they couldn't wait to get back on stage. For audiences, it was a chance to reconnect with live concerts at the Chapin Rainbow Stage.

The Chapin Family (Tom, daughters Lily and Abigail, along with Jen Chapin and her band) opened the festival with a 40th Anniversary concert in observation of Harry Chapin's untimely death. The Huntington Community Band celebrated its delayed 75th Anniversary with outstanding performances. 2021 marks the final season of retiring HCB Music Director Tom Gellert's creative guidance. Tom, you will be missed. Thank you for your tireless advocacy, devotion, inventive and fascinating program selections. We wish you all the best.

Other special nights included *Gumbo, Grits & Gravy* with Guy Davis and Marcella Simien; Sinatra: *The Man & His Music* with the Jazz Loft Big Band, Tom Manuel conducting, Danny Brachen vocalist; and an Eastline Theatre Company's production of Shakespeare's *Romeo & Juliet*. Americana Folk & Roots music held sway with the delightful Isle Of Klezbos Band and the wonderful 15th Huntington Folk Festival, a collaboration with the Folk Music Society of Huntington.

Huntington-born jazz guitar virtuoso Chieli Minucci, with a new line-up of Special EFX All-Stars performed during Jazz Week; followed by Afro-Cuban/Latin percussionist extraordinaire Pedrito Martinez and his group. Orchestra L.I. with Music Director/Conductor David Stewart Wiley and solo violinist David Park performed an all-Beethoven program, and Urban Bush Women gave an inspiring dance performance. Family shows were

prerecorded for streaming, as were the bulk of live performances.

This year HAC incorporated visual arts to the festival. In collaboration with The Heckscher Museum of Art we launched Art Happenings. Art Happenings was a free weekly event in July where a featured artist came to create in the park. The public was invited to create with them or to simply watch the creative process. Separately, HAC had 11 of our artist members work displayed on individual banners surrounding the festival perimeter. We hope to expand on both of these opportunities next year.

Long Island Grants for the Arts

The Huntington Arts Council administers the Statewide Community Regrant Program (SCR), formerly known as Decentralization Regrant Program, to Nassau and Suffolk County artists and nonprofit arts organizations. This program, formed in 1977, supports a variety of categories with the goal of keeping the arts thriving in our communities. The categories are, Creative Communities, Creative Learning, and Creative Individuals.

2022 Overview -The grant workshops for the 2022 SCR cycle took place over the summer, and the application deadline was September 20th. The applications are under review by the panelists. We anticipate having decisions for all of our SCR and LI Arts Council Capacity Building Program applicants before the holidays.

Long Island Arts Grants are made possible with funds from the Statewide Community Regrant (SCR) program of the New York State Council on the Arts and with the support of the Office of the Governor and the NYS Legislature.



Restart NY Regranting

Restart NY Regrant Program is a NEW grant awards program that was made available in August. Grants ranging from \$1000-\$3000 were designated for Long Island organizations or individuals for funding of in-person, live performing arts events taking place from July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022. These funds are discrete from the Statewide Community Regrant (SCR, formerly DEC). Those who have previously received a DEC grant were eligible to receive *Restart NY* funding.

There were two rounds of funding available to our nonprofit organizations and individual artists. Round One was dedicated to

those who received funding through the Decentralization program 2021 cycle who have focused on live performances and programming from July 1 to December 31. Round Two is for new applications creating a new project or program that is live and open to the public. The main focus of this grant pool is to revitalize public arts and cultural programming that enable Nassau and Suffolk communities to experience and re-engage with live performing, literary, media, and visual arts events. The grant application deadline was September 23. We anticipate notification of awardees in mid-November. The future of the arts on Long Island looks bright!

Arts in Education JOURNEY

Established in 1985, JOURNEY is a multi-component arts in education program available to school districts providing resources for learning about world cultures through arts and arts experiences. JOURNEY integrates cultural arts into classroom curriculum encouraging an individualized experience and appreciation of cultural diversity through the arts.

Program Components:

CTLE CULTURAL ARTS WORKSHOPS

Staff development opportunities for teachers using arts as the starting point

to learn about the history, traditions, social systems, and even economics of a culture. Led by indigenous artists, scholars and educators. See below for offerings this fall.

DISCOVERY LENDING CHESTS

These chests bring hands on cultural experiences to students. They consist of cultural artifacts, lessons, books, artworks, musical instruments and other tools. Current cultures available are: Ancient Egypt, Africa, China, Greece, India, Latin America, Middle East and Native America. "Mini" chests available

for Russia and Japanese Tea Ceremony which include artifacts and description cards.

VISITING ARTISTS

Visiting teaching artists from a variety of cultures and artistic genres are available for workshops, residencies and assemblies in the schools. A directory of artists is available.

HIGH ARTS SHOWCASE

This is an exclusive **visual art exhibition** and **performing arts event** opportunity in collaboration with the Huntington Arts Council. JOURNEY partner high school

students are chosen by their teachers to participate in either event, enabling them to gain experience with promotion and interaction with the arts community while presenting their talents.
