

The 57th Huntington Summer Arts Festival will once again feature an abundance of exceptional music, dance and theatre performances by masterful artists both regional, and from around the U.S. & the World. The 2022 Festival which runs from June 24 through August 7th feels somehow more vital and important to the Huntington

community and L.I. than ever before. This year's Festival will not only entertain, but also provide a strong sense of community as we come together to enjoy FREE live entertainment at the Chapin Rainbow Stage in Huntington. Please go to page 19 for the full list of performances detailed in a convenient calendar format.

Opening weekend features three great evenings: the truly innovative and incandescent Cyrille Aimee will astound you with her vocal gymnastics on June 24; followed by Plaza Theatrical's production of the iconic Lerner ϑ Loewe musical Camelot on June 25; and concluding with the Symphonic Pops of L.I. with conductor Stephen Michael Smith on Sunday, June 26. These performances, as with most of the festival start at 8:00 PM.

Powerhouse lyric tenor Anthony Nunziata will enthrall with a program of Broadway & Great American Songbook favorites plus his own heartfelt tunes on July 2, followed by a reinvention of Gilbert & Sullivan's timeless The Mikado on July 3. Dizzy Gillespie's Afro-Latin Experience will get you dancing to Afro-Cuban rhythms on July 9. The High Cyrille Aimee Kings from Dublin Ireland will delight



Celtic music fans on July 15. The 16th Huntington Folk Festival on July 16, a collaboration with the Folk Music Society of Huntington, will feature afternoon showcases, song-swaps (Noon -5:00 PM) and an outstanding evening with Paula Cole & Sophie B. Hawkins. Eastline Theatre Co. brings William Shakespeare's Two Gentlemen of Verona to the stage on July 17.

Several visiting artists exemplify a rich spirit of inclusion. Alsarah & The Nubatones on July 7 with their enchanting East-African Retro Pop; Oran Etkin's Open Arms Project on July 14 that grew out of this talented and sensitive reed player's musical explorations with masters from around the world; and American Patchwork Quartet, on August 5, the latest project of GRAMMY® winner Clay Ross (Ranky Tanky) and three kindred spirits that dives deep into Americana/Roots traditions.

Lucy Kalantari & The Jazz Cats kick things off with a Family show on Tuesday, July 19. Vickie Henson, the new Director of the Huntington Community Band, has promised a special jazz program on Wednesday, July 20. July 21 features a streetwise New York City native born and raised in Washington Heights Lakecia Benjamin & Pursuance paying homage to the music of John & Alice Coltrane. *Come early for a pre-concert "Conversation* with the Artist" with Dan Bilawski, Music Dept. Coordinator at Harborfields CSD and noted Jazz *journalist – 6:15 PM*. On July 22 we welcome Bria Skonberg a trailblazing trumpeter, vocalist and songwriter described as "one of the most versatile and imposing musicians of her generation" (Wall Street Journal). July 23 features Kandace Springs, and once she starts singing, it's pretty clearher music exists apart from the normal rules that govern space, time, and talent. Closing out the week on

the 24th is DIVA Five Play a quintet rooted in the jazz tradition, fueled and inspired by the members' collective, creative vision to swing through the twenty-first century.



Arts in Education JOURNEY

The Huntington Arts Council's JOURNEY Arts in Education Program has been working with local school districts to support cultural arts programs in schools since 1985. Our 8 partner school districts schedule artist presentations, borrow discovery chests, participate in the exclusive student art exhibition – High Arts Showcase and our CTLE teacher professional development courses. This year our partner districts were Cold Spring Harbor, Commack, Harborfields, Huntington, Kings Park, Northport-East Northport, Plainview-Old Bethpage and South Huntington.

CTLE CULTURAL ARTS WORKSHOPS

HAC is a sponsor for New York State Department of Education and provides CTLE (Continuing Teaching and Learning Education) hours as required for teaching certificate holders in New York State. These professional development opportunities embody the goals of the JOURNEY Program that strive to promote cultural appreciation in schools through the arts.

This fall CTLE workshops will be offered in October/November of 2022. The workshops are free for our partner school

VISITING ARTISTS

Icons of the Hindu Texts as Superheroes by Anu Annam was presented virtually at Plainview - Old Bethpage Middle School.

Ancient Indian epics offer a dramatic tapestry of engaging mythology, ripe with characters possessing divine powers. These stories imbue the culture with its values, similar to how Superhero lore reflects and shapes American culture. This workshop is a synergy of Superhero comics, Hindu religious texts and the power of art as a learning tool. It harnesses students' interest in Superhero stories and the comic medium to introduce the Hindu texts through comparative study. Through an interactive presentation and a teacher-led art project, concepts such as Reincarnation, Ahimsa, Moksha, Dharma and Karma - influential tenets of Hindu Indian culture - will be compared and contrasted with Western Superhero districts and available to other teachers in New York State for a fee of \$50.00. VISITING ARTISTS

Partner schools are allocated funds to book Visiting Artists representing a variety of cultures for workshops, residencies and assembles in their schools.

Virtual Whalers and Whaling Program with Scrimshaw Box Craft by Cold Spring Harbor Whaling Museum was recently presented at Washington Primary, Flower Hill Primary, Southdown Primary and Jefferson Primary. This program explored the lives of the 19th century whalers and the importance of whaling in American history, especially on Long Island. The third grade students learned the how, why, and when of whale hunting through this virtual exploration of the Cold Spring Harbor Whaling Museum's galleries. The students examined nautical artifacts and the need for whale conservation today. The students tried carving a scrimshaw box, based on the classic folk craft of whalers.

In this virtual program students worked closely with this master brush painter. The artist engaged students in discussion of the properties of paper, ink, water and simple philosophy of Chinese painting technique. Students learned to create in this great tradition and brought home multiple artworks and understanding of the differences between Asian art techniques and Western.

Discovery Chests

Discovery Chests include google slides containing artifact descriptions and internet resources. With more than 30 physical discovery chests on hand and 10 different world cultures represented. Partner schools have continued to take advantage of these loans through the end of the school year.

High Arts Showcase

In March the exclusive student art exhibition, High Arts Showcase XVIII, presented a superb body of work from 11th and 12th grade students in our JOURNEY partner schools. These students learn firsthand what is involved in a gallery exhibition; from submitting entries and writing an artist statement to titling, framing and pricing their artwork. Four pieces of artwork sold during the exhibition with full proceeds going to the student. Congratulations to the students that presented their work and to those that were awarded honors.




